Empathy has a positive effect on learning. Neuroscientists and psychologists have discovered that an optimal environment reflects an internal brain state well attuned for learning. Research suggests that low-achieving students may benefit the most from caring and supportive relationships with their teachers. Students feel that they are cared for by others and this increases their learning.
